

#### COMMUNICATION AND LANGUAGE

**Nursery Rhymes –** singing and reciting new and familiar rhymes. **Talk for Writing – The Little Red Hen –**reading, re-enacting and retelling with role play. Following instructions

Talking about ourselves, what we can do, what we like/dislike. Singing songs and rhymes, rhyming words. Using imaginative language in role play house and 'The Hub' Talking about our favourite things.

#### **LITERACY**

**Letters and Sounds;** Once the children are settled, we will begin daily phonics lessons using the Jolly phonics and letters and sounds programmes.

**Handwriting** – encouraging correct pencil grip. Writing name with correct letter formation. Writing lists and labels.

**Reading** – as a class, and as individuals. Recognition of own name and that of other children.

How you can help at home:

Your help and support with teaching children to read and write will make a huge difference to your child's success and progress. Initially, each week, your child will be bringing home choosing books to share at home. Your child will choose these books from our class library. Please share these books at home and write a comment in your child's reading record. When your child is ready, we will begin to send home reading books from our school Reading Scheme. Please listen to your child read these books each night and again write a comment in their reading record.

Encourage your child to talk about things that interest them and also to listen to others and sounds around them. Letters and sounds of the week will be sent home once we get started. Please help your child to practise these at home.

#### PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

PE - twice a week once the children are in full time.

How can I move? (travelling)

Dance - listening carefully and following instructions.

Regular use of outdoor school environment; climbing, digging, ball skills. Developing fine motor control with exercises, games and activities. Toileting and washing hands

How you can help at home

Encourage children to dress and undress independently and practise doing up zips, buttons, putting on socks and tights.

Encourage drawing to develop pencil control. Please encourage a correct pencil grip (see back of sheet for details).
