WWT Visit: On Friday 24th January a lady came from the WWT (Wildfowl & Wetland Trust) in Slimbridge to explain the story of the Madagascan Pochard and how they were brought back from the brink of extinction. The pochard was extinct for years - then it wasn't! It was said to have been seen on a remote lake on top of a mountain in Madagascar. So a team of Slimbridge scientists went to investigate. On that lake they came across 19 Pochards. They tried so many times to get eggs, but mainly failed because the newly hatched chicks were swept up and eaten by eagles. Finally, they got some eggs. Pochard can only live in Madagascar but now, the population of birds is going up! Hurray! So this lady came to tell us this moving story and told us to spread the word.
