Dear Parent or Guardian,

As part of our World book day celebrations, the school is again running a Read for Good Sponsored Read and we'd love your child to join in.

The **Sponsored read** will take place **on World book day, Thursday 5th March**. The Children will have extra opportunities throughout the day to read and share stories (at least 60 - 90 minutes throughout the day) and we hope they'll also be able to read or share 10 minutes with you that evening. Each class will record how many minutes the children have read and all the minutes will be added to the whole school target. For younger children, being read to and looking at books, all count toward the total.

Children can choose whatever they want to read - from comics to classics, picture books to audio books ... they are not being assessed, it's all about reading for fun. Sharing books is fine too (in fact recommended!) and they can even include the time taken to complete any of the book related activities being held during the day.
