<u>English</u>

- Imagine Poetry (Talk for Writing)
- The Robot and the Bluebird (Power of Reading) Please do not read this story with your child until after we have explored it.
- The Sound Collector (poetry)

Of course, we will continue to practice our spellings, joining our handwriting and checking over our work to see that it makes sense and that it has all of those key ingredients, i.e. capital letters, full stops, adjectives and conjunctions.

How you can help at home: Visit the library and find new books to share at home. Encourage your child to talk about things that interest them. Practise writing at home e.g. shopping lists, letters to friends, football scores etc. Check that your child is both sitting and holding their pencil correctly. Revisit key spelling lists as regularly as possible. Listen to your child read daily and make a comment in their reading record (even a signature written on the correct day will do).

Design Technology (DT)

The children will plan, design, make, test and evaluate a candle holder in preparation for Christmas. These are also known as 'thumb pots'!

<u>Science</u>

Autumn term 1: Animals including humans
