



Map of the World









Balanced argument: Were the Aztecs and Maya savages?

The Aztec and Maya were fascinating, indigenous people who lived in Meso-American countries: Mexico, Honduras, El Salvador, Guatemala, Belize and Nicaragua. The Aztecs were there from 1100ce - 1521ce and the Maya were there from 1800BCE - 900ce. In 1521ce the Spanish invaded, led by Hernan Cortes.
