- Daily Phonics sessions will continue.
- We will be doing lots of independent writing to develop our writing skills and developing a toolkit to improve our writing.
- Independent reading comprehensions
- Power of Reading: One Day on Our Blue Planet
- Poetry : The Magic Box by Kit Wright

Of course, we will continue to practice our spellings, joining our handwriting and checking over our work to see that it makes sense and that it has all of those key ingredients, i.e. capital letters, full stops, adjectives, strong verbs and conjunctions.

How you can help at home: Visit the library and find new books to share at home. Encourage your child to talk about things that interest them. Practise writing at home e.g. shopping lists, letters to friends, football scores etc. Check that your child is both sitting and holding their pencil correctly. Revisit key spelling lists as regularly as possible. Listen to your child read daily and make a comment in their reading record (even a signature written on the correct day will do).

<u>Science</u>

Summer term 1: Animals including humans

- Notice that animals have offspring which grow into adults
- Describe the basic needs of animals for survival
- Describe the importance of exercise, nutrition and hygiene

Summer term 2: Does it Matter if Bees Go Extinct?

- We will research about bees- why do we need bees? Why are bees threatened and does it matter?

Encourage your child to make money values and to calculate change, to tell you what the time is on an analogue clock and to measure ingredients using scales when cooking.
